Year 2021-22 also brought accreditation through the Association of Classical Christian Schools (ACCS)! So, what does that mean for you and your children?

ACCS offers the only accreditation specifically designed for classical Christian schools. This means that through a process of self-study and an onsite visit by the ACCS accreditation committee, we verified the classical nature of our school's teaching, meeting a foundational set of requirements. Knowing that PCS has met outside standards is an encouragement to us all.

We enjoy seeing the culmination of classical Christian education in our high school students. Using the foundational knowledge of the Grammar stage, along with the logic of the Dialectic stage, they learn to communicate respectfully and thoughtfully in Harkness discussions. Following one such discussion last week, one of our Juniors stated "Our Harkness discussions at PCS are a way for us to gather information and explore topics that we might not otherwise get a chance to talk about, and I think it is a great opportunity to practice our researching skills and abilities to consider subjects from multiple viewpoints. At the end of every Harkness discussion, I always feel more satisfied with my knowledge of the topic and how my class was able to analyze it." These experiences help our students mature in their knowledge of how to articulate persuasive arguments through logic and reason, as evident by each senior's presentation and defense of their thesis.

We thank God for our accreditation and all His provisions and look forward to another rewarding year at Providence Classical School.


- Celebrated our 20th Anniversary with an all-school family picnic. Our founders were invited back to share their thoughts about the 20 years PCS has been in operation.

Financial Report – 2021-22 School Year

Fiscal Year's End June 30, 2022

PCS continues to meet its financial goals and budgetary needs through the generous support of our parents, grandparents, and other friends of the school. As with most private schools, tuition covers approximately 84% of costs. Fundraising support along with other income sources allows us to have a budget surplus. Through a very supportive PCS Community, last year we raised \$47,550 in our Annual Fund Campaign and \$8,700 (net) from our Golf Tournament. Thank you to all who have contributed!



Results from Operations

Last fiscal year's total income grew to \$2.2M due to growth of the school, but there was an attendant increase in expenses to \$2.2M, with a slightly negative operational net income. The Head of School and staff have implemented expense reduction measures for 2022-23 to bring the bottom line into positive territory for the current year.



Student Enrollment

Enrollment at PCS continues to increase. Enrollment for 2021-2022 grew 4% over 2020-2021, which is slightly below the 5% annual goal we have in our strategic plan, but enrollment grew 15% the prior year. We thank God for bringing each and every family to our school!
