Financial Report - 2023-24 School Year


Fiscal Year's End June 30, 2024

PCS continues to meet its financial goals and budgetary needs through the generous support of our parents, grandparents, local businesses, and other friends from the school. As with most private schools, tuition covers only 80% of costs. Fundraising support along with other income sources allows us to have a budget surplus. Through a very supportive PCS Community, last year we raised \$81,312 in our Annual Fund Campaign, \$21,535 from 227 donors through the Give Local 757 campaign, and \$5,848 on our annual 5K. We also received \$1,780 in scholarship funds through the EISTC program from a new partner Renewanation. We continue to be greatly blessed to maintain a restricted Elaine Golden Endowment and an unrestricted PCS Patriot Endowment. Thank you to all our donors!

Results from Operations

Last year's total income remained at \$2.2M. This was very close to the year prior. Expense controls remained in place to balance the budget.
