

Introduction to Essay Writing July 11, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm This workshop is a basic introduction to essay writing. Good for those in middle school or anyone who needs a refresher on the basics of writing strong essays.

What do I write about? July 11, 1:00pm -4:00pm Invention is 90% of the work. This practicum focuses on helping students figure out what they want to write. The intent of this workshop is to incorporate all the skills, tools and tricks learned from the IEW and LTW writing courses in order to tackle prompt driven and student driven essays.

Building a Better Body (Paragraph) July 20, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm This workshop will focus on developing stronger and more detailed body paragraphs. This practicum combines the skills, tools and tricks to help students better organize and articulate their thoughts, ideas and opinions creating better essays.

Assessing your Student's Writing: For Parents only! July 27, 9:00am - 12:00 pm Learn how to assess and grade your student's writing.
